Members of the NCPD and NCPD Explorers will travel in a caravan to four different locations distributing over 3,000 toys to needy children. In a partnership with County Executive-Elect Laura Curran (D-Baldwin) and Legislator Kevan Abrahams' (D-Hempstead) offices, organizations and school districts were notified of the event and given vouchers to participate at one of the following locations along the route:

10:00 am Grace Church Cathedral – 886 Jerusalem Ave, Uniondale

11:30 am Roosevelt HS/Middle School – 1 Wagner Ave, Roosevelt

1:00pm Bethel AME – 420 North Main Street, Freeport

2:30 pm First Church Baldwin – 881 Merrick Road, Baldwin

It is anticipated that over 3,000 children from Pre-K to 6th grade will be receiving a toy, as well as a voucher for a Long Island Nets basketball game donated by the organization.

Thanks to the generous donations from International Warehouse Group, Pacific Link and Talay Rentals, a caravan featuring a float carrying Santa with gifts will arrive at each location to distribute to waiting children.
